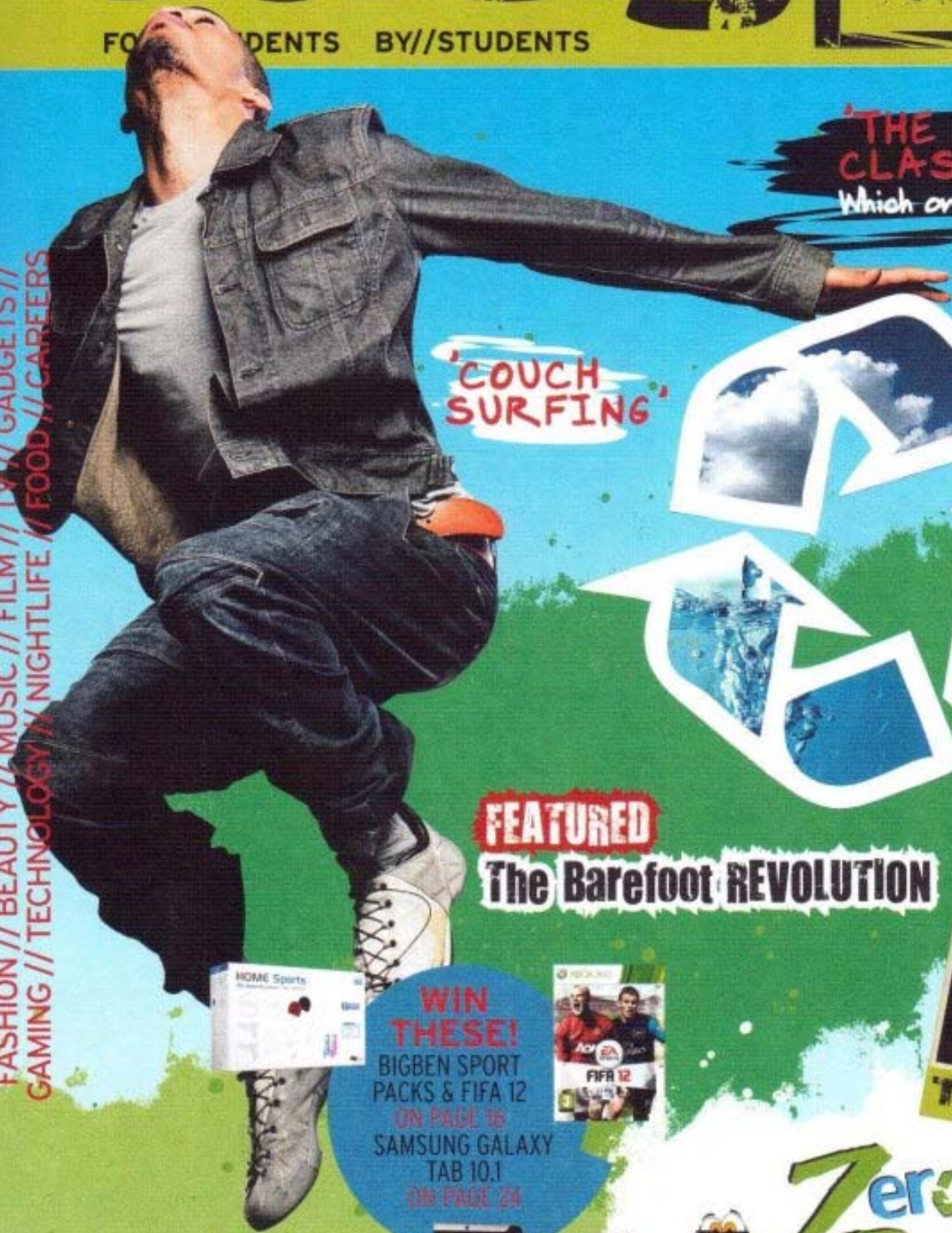

Zero Waste Act

Frustrated by the clouds of pollution emitted from cars? Tired of seeing the streets cluttered with waste? Enough is enough. But if you're not doing anything about it, who will?

Choice. Every day you choose what to wear, who your friends are, what you eat and how you drive to school. Choice is what makes you; it's a reflection on your principles and beliefs. With designer bags spilling over the arms of Beirut's elite, or keffiyeh scarves wrapped around the activists' necks, it's sometimes difficult to know where you fit. You're sick of the pressure to conform and the inability to choose the bus, or bike, yet you're stuck.

Few seem to be choosing a more environmentally-friendly way to live. In Lebanon it has been a seemingly slow movement. This year, The Beirut Green Project rolled out green grass in Sassine Square, inviting the public to a mass-picnic to advocate a greener Beirut. It's still been a quiet movement, but it's evidence that something is simmering in the hearts of the green. More green spaces in the city may seem far off, but there's a project that's here to make a difference, where students are key to changing the current culture of apathy.

Starting out as a campaign, Zero Waste Act has developed into a project spanning 25 schools and involving a whopping 40,000 students and teachers. Initiated as a project for segregating waste, it may sound like a dull one but it's more than just plastic bottles and aluminum cans.

Schools who sign up with Zero Waste Act receive cardboard boxes to segregate their plastic, aluminum and paper waste. Every hallway, canteen, classroom and staff room is kitted out with their own boxes for segregation. Zero Waste Act also educates students and teachers in environmental awareness. In return for the waste accumulated, schools receive various energy saving products such as LED lighting and solar water heaters.

So next time you want to be bold and stand by your principles, choose to be environmental. No one forces you to do it (unfortunately), making it even more important and courageous! It takes effort, but why should it be too easy?
